Accent – the inflections used by a local speaker

Dialect – an offshoot of a language **Multicultural** – an area populated by communities from a wide variety of different countries

Population – the people residing in a country/area

Immigration — Movement of people into an area/country

Migration — Movement from one place to another

Citizenship – legally declaring oneself a citizen of a country

Community – a group of people with shared attributes

Disability — a physical or mental impairment resulting in a reduced ability to perform certain tasks


Paraplegic – relating to the paralysis of the legs or lower body

Ancient Olympics Games

- Began in 775 BC at Olympia. They were dedicated to the Gods primarily Zeus. City states at war held a 'Scared Truce' for one month during the games.
- The last Ancient Olympics were held at Olympia in 393 AD when Roman emperor Theodosius I banned all 'pagan cults' (anything other than Christianity).
- Only men, boys and unmarried girls were allowed to attend and only men could compete.

 Women could own horses in chariot races. Unmarried girls had a separate festival.
- Sports in the Ancient Olympics incl. sprint, wrestling, boxing, long jump, javelin, discus and chariot racing. Winners were given a **wreath of olive leaves** and were treated like heroes.
- 5 Athletes in the Olympics competed naked (originally they wore loin clothes). This was due to the heat and to celebrate the body.
