Key Knowledge.

Minibeasts and other animals are not the only living things that make our gardens their homes. Lots of different plants also manage to live in our gardens. This is because they get sunlight and the right temperature (most of the time) from the sun and water from the rain.

These plants grow from seeds or bulbs and have flowers, leaves, stems and roots to keep them growing until they become mature plants.

Many of the flowers that can be found in gardens and other outdoor areas are planted there by someone using a bulb or a seed and will often need to be looked after however many plants you see about are called wild flowers. This means they just grow and survive naturally in that environment.
