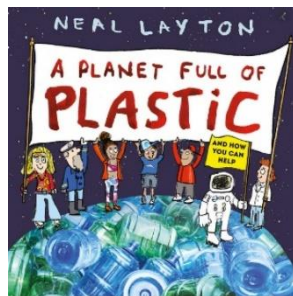




Key Vocabulary

Pollution	when something is added to the environment that is harmless or poisonous to living things.
Material	anything used for building or making something else for example wood, metal & plastic
Plastic	a type of man-made material
Biodegradable	something that can be broken down into nature
Recycle	to turn waste into new materials
Reuse	to use again more than once
Extreme Weather	when weather is very different from the usual weather pattern

Extreme Weather

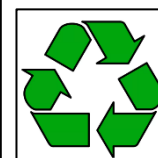
